

## TRAILS COMMITTEE REPORT – Parks and Commons – January 21, 2021

Work sessions – As the Lincoln County COVID risk status fluctuated between “Very high” and “Extreme” Trails-YIPS work sessions in December were cancelled due to COVID restrictions. As safety issues have arisen, they have been handled by volunteers on an individual basis.

Prospect Park – Craig and Sharon have continued work there as well as along the sides of the upper part of the trail.

Signage project – Sign designs, along with a 50% deposit, have been sent to iZone and we should receive the signs and mounting systems within 2 months. The plan is for the signs to be installed by May 1, 2021. With the news that interpretive signs have been stolen from state parks in our area, we opted to have “tamper proof” hardware added to our signs at a cost of \$16/sign.

11th Annual New Year's Day Peace Hike -- With the outstanding work of the planning committee and all the work that CTCLUSI did to contribute to the button design and video, the 11th annual was a huge success. There is no way to assess how many participated or where but, if the buttons are any indication, many people did; most of the 250 peace hike buttons had been given out by Sunday the 3rd. The planning committee decided that, next year, the planning meetings will be held on ZOOM enabling both Tribes to participate more easily without lengthy travel.

CIP requests – At the last PCC meeting, we were asked to identify and submit rough estimates for CIP requests for the coming fiscal year. Consequently, we included requests for \$150K for approximately 1/3 of costs for the boardwalk project and \$35K for improvements to the 804 S trail along Ocean View Drive between 2<sup>nd</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Streets.
