Work on the Commons roof should begin July 23, give or take a few days depending on Northwest Roofing's schedule.

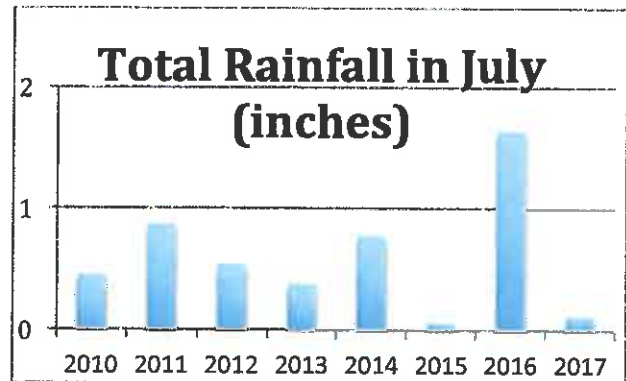
Curbside Green Waste Pickup

The City Council voted in June to participate in Dahl Disposal's curbside green waste pickup program. Green waste bins will be delivered in late July. The every-other-week pickup service will begin in August. You will be able to put all green waste in these bins, including invasive species. Code Enforcement

Summer is a busy time for Yachats' visitors and residents, and it can also be the busiest time for code enforcement. The City Council approved a 2018-19 budget that creates an employee position to handle code enforcement duties and other tasks. Until that person is hired, the City has hired a temporary person to address code enforcement issues.

There are several ways to report code enforcement issues. These include:

- Stop by City Hall to fill out a complaint form

- Call City Hall at 541-547-3565 and hit the * (star) key
- Call the code enforcement cell phone at 541-590-0053

During the summer, issues tend to focus on vacation rentals and property with overgrown or noxious weeds. The city has extensive codes dealing with both. You can learn about these ordinances at www.yachatsoregon.org. The vacation rental regulations are in Chapter 4.08 of

the Yachats Municipal Code. The overgrown lot and noxious weed ordinance is in Chapter 5.08.110.

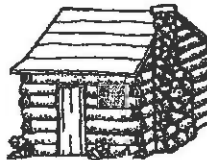
